

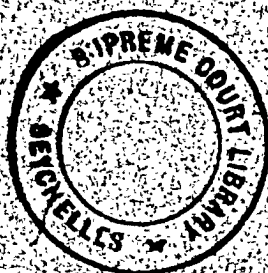

AN ACT to alter the Constitution

ENACTED by the President and the National Assembly —

This Act may be cited as the Constitution of the Republic of Seychelles (Second Amendment) Act, 1995. Short title

Interpretation
S.I. 38 of 1993

2. In this Act, "Constitution" means the Constitution of the Republic of Seychelles as set out in the Constitution of the Republic (Third Republic) (Promulgation) Notice, 1993.

Amendment
of Article 146
of the
Constitution

3. Article 146 of the Constitution is amended as follows—

(a) in clause (3) by repealing the words 'an appeal or a complaint' and substituting therefor the words 'a complaint';

(b) in clause (7) by repealing the definition of 'public authority' and substituting therefor the following definition—

public authority means a Ministry, department or division of the Government";

(c) by repealing clause (8).

Transitional

4. Any complaint made to the Public Service Appeal Board under Article 146 of the Constitution and pending before the Board on the date of commencement of this Act, being a complaint which could not have been made to the Board had this Act been in force on the date the complaint was made, shall continue to be dealt with by the Board as if this Act has not come into force.

I certify that 22 members of the National Assembly voted the Bill at the sitting of the National Assembly held on 14th March, 1995 when the Bill as a whole was put to the vote in the Assembly
