PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION ACT

(Cap 196)

Electricity (Amendment) Regulations, 2020

In exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 17 and 19 of the Public Utilities Corporation Act, the Minister responsible for Energy makes the following regulations —

1. These regulations may be cited as the Electricity (Amendment) Regulations, 2020 and shall come into force on 1st April, 2020.

Citation and Commencement

2. The Electricity Regulations, are amended by repealing the Schedule thereto and substituting therefor the following Schedule.

7. SURCHARGE

For each period of 30 days or part thereof after an amount is due, a surcharge of 2 per cent shall be levied on a compounding basis on an unpaid amount.

8. FUEL VARIATION

The rate per unit of electricity consumed under the tariff items in this Part shall be varied upwards or downwards by 0.28 cent for each one cent per litre variation in the weighted average fuel price and shall become effective from a meter reading period commencing on or after the first day of the month immediately following a fuel price variation.

9. ROUNDING

In calculating the total monthly charge for electricity consumed under the tariff items in this Part, the total shall be rounded to the nearest 5 cents above or below, 2 cents being treated as the nearest 5 cents below and 3 or 4 cents being treated as the nearest 5 cents above.

S.I. 59 of 2020

TOURISM DEVELOPMENT ACT, 2019

(Act 8 of 2019)

Tourism Development (Compounding of Offences) Regulations, 2020

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 18 read with section 16 of the Tourism Development Act, 2019 the Minister responsible for Tourism makes the following regulations —

1. These regulations may be cited as the Tourism Development (Compounding of Offences) Regulations, 2020.

Citation

2.(1) The Minister may, in consultation with the Attorney General, compound an offence under section 15 of the Act.

Compounding of offence

- (2) The Minister may offer the compounding of an offence to a person who has been reported as accepted the commission of the offence and agreed in writing to the compounding of the offence.
- **3.**(1) The Minister may propose an amount to be paid by the person who committed the offence and such amount shall not be less than one half of the fine and not more than the maximum fine specified for the offence.

Amount of fine

- (2) The Minister shall thereupon seek the advice of the Attorney General.
- (3) The Minister shall, on receiving the advice of the Attorney General fix the penalty and notify to the person concerned demanding him or her to pay the penalty within 2 months from the date of receipt of the notice.

Payment of fine and refusal to pay

- **4.**(1) A person who receives the notice under regulation 3 may either pay the amount fixed for the offence or inform the Minister of his or her refusal to accept amount of fine.
- (2) The payment of the fine fixed under regulation 3 may be made in cash, cheque or bank transfer.
- (3) In the event of non acceptance of the fine fixed under regulation 3 or non-payment of the fine within the time specified under subregulation (3) of regulation 3, prosecution proceedings shall be continued and if not already initiated shall be initiated against the person.
