**JUDGMENT**

**Perera J**

The Petitioner seeks a dissolution of his marriage on the ground that the Respondent has behaved in such a way that he cannot reasonably be expected to live with her. It is also averred that the parties had been living apart for a period of more than two years.

The parties were lawfully married on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2001. There are no children born of the marriage. The Respondent who was served with notice of the petition, appeared in Court on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2005, and consented to the granting of the divorce.

The Petitioner, testified that the marriage has broken down irretrievably and that there is now no hope of reconciliation.

Accordingly, a conditional order of divorce is entered. This order shall be made absolute at the expiry of six weeks from the date hereof.
