



# ONE SEYCHELLES CONSTITUTION

## Vision of 'One Seychelles'

"One Seychelles" is committed to uniting and upholding our sovereignty, diversity and dignity of our creole culture and heritage while upholding the highest standards of integrity and the application of the 'rule of law and order' applicable to all. This will be achieved through enhanced strategic investments in the human resources of diverse knowledge and talents of the Seychellois islanders, who will be empowered and equipped to be the drivers and ultimate beneficiaries of the fruits of their respective labor and contributions.

## Mission of 'One Seychelles'

"One Seychelles" commits to placing the Seychellois islanders at the centre of all its sustainable development programmes to foster a peaceful, harmonious and inclusive society.

It aims to substantially improve access, relevance and quality of health care, education and training for all, application of the 'rule of law' to ensure security for all and the business environment. It will firmly address bureaucracy, the alarming and increasing problems of illicit substance abuse and related social ills affecting our nation, creating the enabling environment for further socio-economic welfare and growth, in dignity and care.

It shall, at all cost, maintain the peace, security, and harmony of our nation where fairness and an honest government promotes its creole cultural heritage of diverse ethnicity, religion, different political opinions that are upheld in respect to all fundamental principles of human rights.

## ARTICLE I

### 1.0. DESCRIPTION

1.1. The registered name of the Party shall be the "ONE SEYCHELLES" abbreviated as (1S).

1.2 In creole, the Party name shall be translated to "Y'EN SEL SESEL" abbreviates as (YESS).

1.3 The Party colors shall be Orange.

1.4. 'ONE SEYCHELLES' (hereinafter referred to as 'the Party') shall be defined as a Socio-Liberal pragmatic Democratic political party. It shall be characterised by its equal beliefs in a mixed and contextualized socio-economic set up that is predominantly a 'free-market' that, encourages Private-Public sector Partnerships, human dignity and decency based on the rule of law applicable to all, in a free democratic and sovereign state.

1.5 Given the political history of Seychelles, the party firmly believes in the critical importance

of investing in effective 'Truth & Reconciliation' as an essential ingredient to harmonize the diversity that characterizes our creole culture and nation.

1.6 The Party firmly believes in the highest levels of patriotism, honesty and meritocracy in our democracy. In this light, the Party is in favor of installing a 'Government of National Unity' where, regardless of political or religious opinions and affiliations, race and sexual orientation the best trained, experienced and equipped person/s capable of efficiently delivering respective public services to the Seychellois islanders, be called upon to assume key responsibilities for effective and efficient public services delivery to the people of Seychelles.

1.7 The Party shall be a member of International Organisations and partner to sister political parties, non-governmental organizations commensurate with the stances articulated in Article 1.4, 1.5 and 1.6 above.

## **ARTICLE II**

### **2.0. OBJECTS**

The objects of the Party shall be:

2.1. To secure the election of the President of the Party to the office of President of the Republic of Seychelles. In the event the Party President is incapable or does not wish to be a Presidential Candidate, then the National Executive Committee (NEC) of the party will propose and select the most eligible and capable candidate/s for ultimate approval of the Party's National Conference

2.2. To seek to recruit the highest possible number of party members in each electoral districts of the Republic and to establish in each District a party representation with committees in accord with Article XVI of this Constitution.

2.3. To receive nominations of candidates who are of character and who are committed to exercise the responsibilities of the office and stand as candidates for the National Assembly in concordance with Party Statement of Principles set out in Article III of this Constitution. The National Executive Committee (NEC) will be vested with the responsibility to consider and approve potential candidates for respective districts.

2.4. The Party will encourage the highest possible number of Party members to become active in its political mobilization and recruitment work in each district and sub-district. The main objects of the party include:

2.5. To maintain a National Headquarters and Area offices to undertake the political and Party functions

2.6. To provide a democratic, solid structure through which the President of the Party shall be elected and through which the membership of the Party shall make their views known.

**ARTICLE XII****12.0 Party National Assembly Forum (NAF)**

12.1. There shall be a NAF of all those Members of National Assembly of the Republic who are members of the Party and supportive of the Statement of Principle of the Party.

12.2. The NAF shall be a consultative committee for the President and Secretary General on political policy and shall determine the Party's positions and interventions in the National Assembly.

12.3. The President shall be Chairman of the NAF.

12.4. The Secretary-General shall preside over the NAF in the absence of the President. In the absence of the latter, the Floor Leader shall assume Chairpersonship.

12.5. a) The NAF shall meet at least once before the opening of the National Assembly and regularly thereafter.

b) Meetings of the NAF shall be convened by the President, Secretary General or by the Floor Leader.

c) The Quorum of the NAF shall be half its Members.

**ARTICLE XIII****13.0. VICE-PRESIDENTS**

13.1. There shall be up to two Honorary Vice-Presidents of the Party.

13.2. The Vice-Presidents shall be appointed by the President.

13.3. The Vice-Presidents shall hold office for three years and shall be eligible for re-appointment.

13.4. The Executive, Secretary-General and the NAF shall be entitled to recommend individuals to the President for his consideration for appointment as Vice-Presidents.

**ARTICLE XIV****14.0. FINANCE**

14.1 a) There shall be a Treasurer who shall be the principal fundraiser of the Party.

b) The Treasurer shall be the Chairman of the Board of Finance and assisted by a Deputy Treasurer.

c) The Treasurer shall be appointed by the President in consultation and approval of the

NEC.

d) The Treasurer shall hold office for three years and shall be eligible for re-appointment.

14.2. a) There shall be a Board of Trustees in whom shall be vested the Party's assets.

b) The Board of Trustees shall consist of the President, the General Secretary, the Treasurer, and two other persons appointed annually by the National Executive Committee.

c) The President shall be the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and shall exercise both a deliberative and a casting vote.

d) The Board of Trustees shall meet at least once a year and shall be convened by the President. The quorum shall be three members.

14.3. There shall be a Party Board of Finance which shall be the fundraising organisation of the Party as a whole and shall supervise the fund-raising of the District and Sub-district Committees.

14.4. The Board of Finance shall consist of the Board of Trustees and each of District party Chairpersons and their respective treasurers.

14.5. a) The President shall be Chairman of the Board of Finance, and in his absence, the Treasurer of the Party shall preside.

b) The Treasurer shall convene meetings of the Board of Finance at least twice a year.

c) The quorum of the Board of Finance shall be 50 plus one member of the totality of the Board of Finance.


d) The Treasurer will be responsible for providing regular financial reports to the NEC, including the mandatory annual financial report.

## ARTICLE XV

### 15. NATIONAL PARTY - STRUCTURE

15.1. The Party Conference shall consist of the following members:

- a) The President
- b) The Secretary-General
- c) The Vice-Presidents



- d) The Treasurer
- e) The Members of the National Executive Committee
- f) The Party Members of the National Assembly
- g) Party Members elected by the District Associations according to the scale laid down by the Executive.
- h) Up to twelve Party Members nominated by the President.
- i) The National Chairman and two other representatives each of the Youth Movement, Women Movement, Elderly and Trade Union Movement.
- j) Two representatives elected by each organisation affiliated to the Party under Article XXII of this Constitution.

15.2. All Party Members of the National Conference shall exercise one vote.

15.3. The right to submit motions for debate by the National Conference shall be held by:

- a) The Executive
- b) The National Assembly Party Members
- c) The Vice-Presidents
- d) District Committees
- e) The National Committees of the Youth Movement, Women, Elderly Movements and the Trade Unionist Movement.
- f) Approved Affiliated Organisations.

Motion to be proposed by any one of the above shall have to be seconded by no less than two Executive members.

15.4. The Motions to be debated at National Party Conferences shall be approved by the National Executive Committee.

15.5. a) The Executive shall lay down Standing Orders for the Party National Conference.

- b) The Standing Orders shall be able to provide for the removal of people from the meeting on the grounds of disruptions and disorderly conduct.

c) Any other officer or officers laid down in the Rules shall be nominated by the NEC with a five-year term in office.

d) The local Party Chairpersons of the Youth Movement, Women Movement, Elderly Movement and the Trade Union Movement organised in the districts shall be:

e) Ordinary party members who shall be the most politically active members of the District Committee and who shall be appointed to the District Committee Structure by the elected and nominated District Officers under the direction of the National Party Executive Committee.

18.5. The Executive shall permit ordinary party members of District to be elected to the District Chairperson in their respective District's Annual General Meeting in a process defined by the NEC.

## ARTICLE XIX

### DISTRICT ASSOCIATIONS - FUNCTIONS

19.1. The Association shall canvass from door-to-door and by telephone and all forms of social media to establish who the supporters of the Party in the district are and recruit new members.

19.2. The Association shall recruit as many supporters as possible to become members of the Party and shall encourage members to become active in the work of the District Committee.

19.3. On polling days the party District Committee shall work to ensure that the maximum number of the party's members turn out to vote for the Party's candidates.

19.4. The District Committee shall organise stimulating and comprehensive political and social programmes relevant to all its members and affiliated supporters.

19.5. a) The District Committee may be delegated to collect the annual subscriptions of members.

b) The District Committee shall under the authority of the Board of Finance raise funds on its initiative.

c) The District Committee shall pay an agreed quota annually to the Board of Finance.

19.6. The District Committee shall play its full and proper part in the campaigns and other political work of the Party led by higher Party bodies.


19.7. The District Officers shall report to the national Party Executive on the state of opinion in the District and Sub-Districts at large.

## ARTICLE XX

### 20. District COMMITTEE -STRUCTURE

20.1. The National Party Executive shall divide the country into groups of districts, each of which shall have District and Sub-District Committees.

20.2. The District Committee structure shall consist of:

a) An Area Chairman elected annually at the District Annual General Meeting at which every party member resident in the District shall be entitled to vote.

b) An area Secretary and Treasurer who shall be appointed annually by the National Executive after consultations with the elected District Chairperson and active members.

c) The district Chairpersons of the Youth Movement, Elderly Movement, Women Movement and the Trade Unionists representation.

f) No more than three other co-opted party members of the respective District for which the Executive in consultation with the elected Chairperson shall be entitled to make recommendations.

20.3. a) General annual district meetings shall be held not less than once a year.

b) They shall be called by the Chairperson or at the request of no less than twelve members.

c) The quorum for District Meetings shall be 51% of all the District structure inclusive the elected Chairperson, the Secretary and Treasurer.

20.4. District Committees shall corporate with the National Executive Committee in the training of activists and shall recommend individuals suitable for training to the NEC.

## ARTICLE XXI

### 21. SUBDISTRICT - FUNCTIONS

21.1. The District Committee shall supervise the work of their Sub-District Committees in all respects and shall do so in accordance with instructions issued by the National Executive Committee.

21.2. Sub-District Committees shall partake actively in political campaigns in their respective Areas.

21.3. Sub-District Committees shall promote understanding of and support for the Party's Principles and policies among the residents of their respective Areas.

## **ARTICLE XXII**

### **YOUTH MOVEMENT**

22.1. There shall be a Youth Section of the Party.

22.2. The Executive shall lay down Rules for the Youth Movement.

22.3. The Youth Movement shall have an elected National Chairperson, and District Chairpersons nominated and confirmed at Annual General Meetings by all members.

## **ARTICLE XXIII**

### **TRADE UNIONISTS**

23.1. There shall be a Trade Union Section of the Party called the TRADE UNIONISTS.

23.2. The Executive shall lay down Rules for the Trade Unionists.

23.3. The Trade Unionists shall have an elected National Chairperson through their organizational constitution and standing orders; The elected Chairperson and district representatives person shall be presented at the Annual General Meetings

## **ARTICLE XXIV**

### **AFFILIATED ORGANISATIONS**

24.1. Civic organisations which support the Statement of Principles laid down in Article III of this Constitution shall be able to request affiliation to the Party.

24.2. The Executive shall decide whether to affiliate an organisation to the Party and shall be able to disaffiliate an organisation at any time.

24.3. An Affiliated Organisation shall pay an annual quota to the Board of Finance set annually in agreement with the Board of Finance.

24.4. Affiliated Organisations which have paid their annual quota shall be represented on the National Party Conference under Article XV Clause 1 Sub-Clause (k) of this Constitution.

**ARTICLE XXV****25. SELECTION OF CANDIDATES**

25.1. The President, in consultation with NEC, shall select candidates to contest national election. The President shall consult the District Committees in the process of selecting and presentation of candidates for National Assembly election. A simple majority of the NEC shall do final approval for the candidates.

**ARTICLE XXVI****26. AMENDMENTS**

26.1. This Constitution shall be amended by a motion submitted and passed in the ordinary way by the National Party Conference.
